SPARK also works closely with the CTE Advisory Committee support high school programs for cybersecurity, welding, automotive, culinary, cabinetry, engineering, HVAC and other classroom instruction.

These children are the basis for our community's future growth and prosperity, and it is only possible to build on that strong foundation with the continued support of our corporate and community partnerships. In 2020-21 SPARK distributed \$86,478 to graduating high school seniors, totaling 45 awarded scholarships to 23 different colleges.


